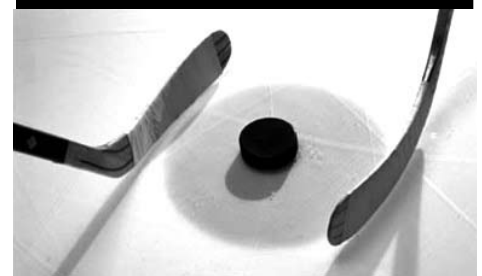

# Canterbury B1 Bantam Hornets win 35th Annual Cougar Cup!

**Ottawa, January 11, 2009** – The Canterbury Bantam B1 Hornets B1 captured the B Division crown of the 35th Annual Cougar Cup. The 16-team tournament, hosted by Gloucester Centre of the GHA, featured teams from across Ottawa, western Quebec and Montreal.

The Hornets opened the Cougar Cup on Friday night, defeating Montreal's Lakeshore Lions 7-4.

Ben Lewis strong performance earned him MVP honours in the opener.

Saturday morning's 5-1 victory over the Leitrim Hawks, who had yet to lose a game this season, clinched a spot in the semi-finals of the tournament by securing victory in POOL A of the tournament. Connor Grimes led the team with four assists in the game, earning

him game MVP honours.

The Hornets tied Blackburn 2-2 in Sunday morning final round robin game. Josh Saikaly joined Ben and Connor as a Game MVP honouree.

# Canterbury Midget 'A' Captures 5th Annual Capital House League Championship

On Sunday, February 8, 2009, the Canterbury Midget A team won the 5th Annual Capital House League Championships at the Bell Sensplex with a 3-0 win over Federation de l'Est Tigres from Montreal. Canterbury completed the sixteen team tournament as the only team to go undefeated. Their record of five wins and one tie was built on a tournament high fourteen goals for and a tournament low three goals against. Nick Finocchio, replacing the injured Tanner Poulin in goal, recorded a tournament high four shutouts to lead all goaltenders in the tournament with an microscopic 0.50 GAA.

“Everyone was committed to a common goal and they gave everything they had to earn this title,” said Hashm Nasser, head coach of the Canterbury squad. “I’m so proud of our effort, commitment and dedication. We really grew together as a team this weekend, and I believe when talented teams are combined with a strong work ethic, they can achieve truly great things.”

Defensively, Canterbury was led by a “shut-down” defence corps of Tony Nahas, Blair Coburn, Hugh Gillen, Jake Clifford and J. D. Knowles (who was Mr. Versatility playing both forward and defence). This group consistently

frustrated opposing forwards, taking away their time and space leaving them with few options and even fewer scoring opportunities. They also played an important role in the offensive zone contributing on the score sheet with timely goals or assists.

Offensively, a relentless fore-check and constant pressure allowed Canterbury to come up with big plays when they were needed. Whether it was Ben Elliott dangling and coming out from the corner to bury the puck in the top shelf, wonderful quick puck movement from J. D. Knowles to Ryan Kung to Geoff Gross for a tap-in goal, waves of power-drives to the net by Tyler Pappas and Pearce Dunlay, or dipping and diving (and even sometimes shooting) by Zach Jackson and Geordie Price, the puck was either in the back of the net or opposition teams were unable to gain control of the puck, much less clear their zone.

Canterbury’s hardware collection began this year in West End’s Holiday House League tournament in December, also at the Sensplex. Following some controversy during the preliminary round, Canterbury advanced to the quarterfinals on Sunday where they tamed the Lakeshore Tigers from Montreal 6-1. Again

supported by strong goaltending – this time from Tanner Poulin – Canterbury scored two third period goals to eliminate the Cumberland Devils (A1) 3-1 in one of the semi-finals to advance to the tournament final.

The final pitted arch rivals South End Capitals against Canterbury. After exchanging first period goals, both goaltenders shut the door for the rest of regulation, forcing the game to overtime. After a scoreless first overtime (four-on-four), a second overtime period (three-on-three) was needed to determine a winner. A goal late in the second overtime period denied Canterbury a championship in this tournament, and Canterbury was awarded the finalist trophy. While Canterbury was unable to capture this title, the experience clearly helped Canterbury in their most recent championship victory.

“We’ve already achieved so much this year, and we’ve done it while dealing with a great deal of adversity. This team has real heart. It’s truly a pleasure to see this group of young men wearing the Canterbury jerseys representing our community with such class and pride,” said coach Nasser.

Congratulations to the entire team and good luck in the upcoming playoffs.

## *Thunder Rumbles to Victory at Akwesasne Bantam B Tournament*

In a performance reminiscent of other great goaltenders who have led their teams to championships – including one with the same first name – Patrick Turcotte registered three shutouts as the Canterbury Thunder went undefeated on their way to winning the Akwesasne Minor Hockey Association Bantam B tournament at the end of January.

The one day, 6-team tournament on the Akwesasne Mohawk First Nation reserve near Cornwall brought together teams from Akwesasne, Belleville, Clarence Creek, Cornwall, Ottawa and Kahnawake, a First Nation community near Montreal.

The Thunder opened the tournament with a convincing 5-0 win over the Kahnawake Mohawks. The Mohawks started strong and forced Patrick to make a number of memorable saves, but it was the Thunder's Graham Bianchi who finally opened the scoring in the last minute of the period as he finished off a fine passing play with line-mates Brandon Gencher and Justin Lalonde. Devon Bergeron added an insurance marker early in the second, while Patrick calmly continued making one spectacular save after another to preserve the two-goal lead.

An "own-goal" by the Mohawks early in the third that was caused by Bradley Tighe's tenacious forecheck widened the gap to 3-0. Sensing victory, the Thunder then shifted their game into high gear and scored four times. Unfortunately, the refs found some creative reasons to disallow two goals by Chris Ayoub and Matt McDonald, including an unfastened chin strap. The fact the chin strap was undone by the Kahnawake's goaltender's glove crashing into a Thunder's helmet apparently didn't matter.

The refs didn't limit their creativity to disallowing goals however, and the Thunder found themselves shorthanded three times in the third. Fortunately, they were not distracted by the officiating and while Patrick repeatedly turned away scoring chances to record his first



shutout, Justin and Cory Hogan netted two more goals. Not surprisingly, Patrick was named the game's MVP.

The Thunder's second game against Cornwall was a hard fought, low scoring match. Cory opened the scoring for the Thunder about half-way through the first after some crisp passes from Justin and Graham. Patrick's heroics preserved the one-goal lead through two and a half periods until Justin was able to put the game away with an empty-netter with 55 seconds left. Justin's two points earned him the game's MVP.

As is usually the case with all great goaltenders, Patrick saved his best performance for the final against the hometown Akwesasne team. Patrick was absolutely stellar in net, turning away shot after shot from the hometown favourites. Soon chants of "Patrick! Patrick! Patrick!" reverberated through the Wolf's Den arena.

While Patrick was frustrating the Akwesasne shooters, the Thunder were getting their own chances at the other end of the rink, but couldn't find the back of the net. After three periods the score was deadlocked 0-0 and the fans perched on the edge of their seats for the shoot out.

Patrick turned away Akwesasne's first two shooters, while the Thunder's first two attempts – by Matt Critch and Graham – were also stopped. The thundering roar that followed Bradley Kouri's potentially championship-winning goal was hushed by Akwesasne's first goal, a world-class deke that probably would have fooled most NHL goalies. It was the first and only goal Patrick allowed in the tournament.

With both teams tied after the first three shots, Justin picked up the puck at center ice and moved gingerly toward the goal. His deke to the goalie's left found the back of the net. The Thunder were now one save away from the championship.

As the rink became quiet again you could almost hear peoples' heads swiveling to the other end of the rink. As the Akwesasne player started his approach to the goal, Patrick calmly watched and waited. As the shooter got closer, Patrick waited. A few meters from the crease the Akwesasne player finally made his move. Patrick reacted. The puck stayed out! The Thunder had won!! Guess who was named MVP?

# Atom 'A' Bell Capital Cup Finalists

The season of contrasts continues for the Canterbury Atom 'A' Crusaders. With only one win in regular season play, the team once again shone through in tournament play at the Bell Capital Cup.

First up in round-robin play were the Blackburn Stingers. Canterbury scores twice in the first and holds on to take the first game 2-1. Next up were the Leitrim Hawks A2. The Crusaders took the lead late in the first period by notching the first goal. Leitrim wasn't going to make things easy though, evening the score in a controversial goal just as the buzzer sounded. The game remained tied until early in the third when defenseman Martin Lafontaine made scoring look easy and fired in the winning goal. The third game in the round robin ended up as a "gimmie" as Canterbury had already advanced based on the rules of the tournament. None the less, the team went on to defeat the Stittsville Warriors 7 to 2.

The quarter final game pitted the Crusaders against the unknown yet fifth seeded team, the Beijing Hokay Snow Leopard. The Crusaders led off the scoring with the only goal in the first period. The Snow Leopards were not about to let Canterbury off easily though, and tied up the game early in the second. Canterbury again took the lead late in the second, only to have Beijing tie the game up early in the third. Beijing then suffers a major set back when their top scoring player takes not one, but two penalties. The Crusaders capitalize on the power play and go on to win 4-2.

Winning the quarter final game meant that the fourth-seeded Crusaders advanced to meet their league rival and top-ranked team, the West End Hurricanes. The Hurricanes showed that they were out for blood when their defense scored 30 seconds into the game. The Crusaders were not going to give up easily though. Canterbury's Cameron Hawtin responds three minutes later to even up the game. The game remained tied until midway through the second when the Hurricane's defence once again scored. Things were looking bleak for the Crusaders until Hawtin came

through at 13:40 in the third to tie the game up. The championship game late on New Year's day pitted the Crusaders against the third ranked Ottawa Center Chargers. The Chargers lead off the scoring in the first period. Neither team scores further until the third period where the Chargers score two more goals before Canterbury responds with one of its own. Despite a terrific effort by the team, the final ends up 4-1 for the Chargers. None the less, the team had a fantastic run placing second out of 33 teams.

# Federal Children's Fitness Tax Credit Receipts

Treasurer, Bob Pelland (613-523-7540)

The Federal Children's Fitness Tax Credit (CFTC) Receipts, for eligible recipients who were under 16 at any time during the 2008 calendar year, were provided to your team manager in late January/early February so hopefully they have been distributed to team members by now.

This CFTC claim will be made as part of one's federal non-refundable tax credits (line 365 on Schedule 1 of the Federal Income Tax form) by either parent provided that another person/parent has not already claimed the same fees and that the total claimed does not exceed the maximum amount that would be allowed if only one of you were claiming the tax credit. Although you will not need to submit the receipt issued to you by the CHA when you file your 2008 tax return, you will need to keep your receipt in case the Canada Revenue Agency asks for them when verifying your claim. Receipts should be kept for six (6) years.

Only the basic registration fees are considered eligible for the CFTC based on our interpretation of "eligible fees". The amount paid for the Save-a-Buck coupon books and late fees, if any, are not eligible for the CFTC.

If you have not received your CFTC Receipt, please check with your team manager. If the receipt has been lost or misplaced, please contact the CHA Treasurer, Bob Pelland, at treasurer@canterburyhockey.ca who will issue you a duplicate copy.
