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Time to Register

As one hockey season ends, another begins. It is time once again to start thinking about registering with the Canterbury Hockey Association (CHA) for the 2011-12 season.

This season will be the 8th year of operation for the Bytown Minor Hockey League (BMHL), which is composed of the CHA, along with Ottawa Centre, Ottawa East, SouthEnd, and West End – all of the Bytown District (commonly referred to as District B). The BMHL encompasses only house league divisions and is **tiered** – with “A”, “B”, and “C” levels – to allow players to play with children of similar skill levels. We expect to have at least one “C” team at all levels from Novice through to Midget. As in the past, the BMHL will be **non-contact** whereas competitive hockey allows for body checking, except at the Atom level.

Registration Process for the 2011-12 Season

For the 2011-12 season, all new and returning players – whether they played last season at the house league level or the competitive B, A, AA, or AAA level – will be required to register with their home association based on their official place of residence.

Since **players who wish to play this season at the competitive level** – which now includes the Ottawa Jr. 67's AAA Hockey Club and the Ottawa Sting Minor Hockey Association (OSMHA) – must ‘make’ a competitive team each year, they too **must initially register with their respective ‘home’ association** be it the Canterbury Hockey Association (CHA) or another eligible association within District B, **prior to the start of the competitive association’s first tryouts**. This is an ODMHA requirement to ensure that all such players are covered by the ODMHA insurance prior to stepping on the ice.

All returning players whose ‘home’ association is the CHA should receive, as part of this mail-out newsletter, a personalized registration form containing their pertinent information from the existing registration system. A new player to the CHA (i.e., any player who did not play for the CHA in the 2010-11 season) may print a blank registration form, which includes the District B Code of Conduct, from the Canterbury web site at www.canterburyhockey.ca. **All new players** must include a photocopy of the player’s birth certificate, or equivalent (e.g. baptismal certificate), as proof of age.

Register Early and Avoid Late Fees

Every returning and new CHA player (from Initiation to Juvenile) will be guaranteed a spot in the 2011-12 CHA House League hockey program provided they register by 30 June 2011.



The following **graduated registration fee structure** shall apply to the 2011-12 season:

- for those registering **on or before 30 June 2011**, the ‘basic’ registration fees shall apply;
- for those registering **in July and August 2011**, a **late fee of \$25.00 per player** will be added to the ‘basic’ registration fees otherwise payable; and

- for those registering **after August 2011**, a **late fee of \$50.00 per player** will be added to the ‘basic’ registration fees otherwise payable.

The purpose of this graduated registration fee structure is to encourage members to register as early as possible since a commitment on the number of teams the CHA is expected to have at each level must be made in early September to ensure that we can get the necessary ice allotment from the City of Ottawa via District B.

Any late fees received are credited to the **CHA’s Jannis Klein Fund for Kids** to help those with an identified and confirmed financial need. Jannis Klein was a former Secretary on the CHA Executive who passed away during the 2007-08 season as a result of cancer and the CHA’s Fund for Kids was re-named in her honour.

Association Fundraiser – Ottawa 67’s tickets

As an integral part of the 2011-12 registration process each CHA player (except a Juvenile player) will be required to purchase a minimum of five (5) Ottawa 67’s tickets per player at \$10.00 per ticket, total cost of \$50.00 per player (see separate article on this Association fundraising venture on page 8). You may sell your tickets, which will have a face value of at least \$15.00, to relatives, friends, neighbours, co-workers, etc. to recoup all or part of your \$50.00 or you may keep one or more tickets for your own use. *The choice is yours.*

An additional \$50.00 has been included in the posted registration fee structure to guarantee the sale of these tickets.

The actual tickets will be distributed to the individual players through the Team Manager once the teams are formed and the team lists have been completed. This is expected to be done in mid- to late-November.

Your registration form and payment (cheque or money order payable to the “Canterbury Hockey Association” or “C.H.A.”) must be submitted by mail to:

There will be no in-person registrations.

2011-12 CHA Hockey Fee Structure. For those registering on or before 30 June 2011, the 2011-12 CHA hockey fee structure per player and payment schedule, which includes the charge for the Ottawa 67's tickets, is noted in the accompanying table.

There are two payment options –

Option A: immediate and full payment by no later than 30 June 2011;

Option B: instalment payment plan with 3 payments as indicated in the table.

Where Option B is used, you are requested to send all three (3) post-dated cheques along with your registration form.

No increase in fees for 2011-12: For the 2011-12 season, the registration fees will remain the same as last season. The primary reason for this is that the City of Ottawa hourly rate for ice has been frozen for the 2011-12 season. Also, the cost of referees will also remain unchanged for the 2011-12 season.

As indicated in our May 2010 Newsletter, last season's registration fee structure was kept artificially low as a result of planned transfers from our cash reserves of \$25,000. However, a transfer of only \$8,000 was necessary due primarily to lower ice and referee costs (partly as a result of forming 2 fewer teams than anticipated and an unexpected contribution of \$5,000 toward our ice costs from the East Ottawa Vanier Voyageurs Bingo Account via District B) along with lower equipment expenses as fewer new sets of jerseys were purchased than budgeted for. To avoid an increase in the 2011-12 registration fee, the CHA Executive Committee has agreed to a further planned transfer from our cash reserves of up to \$12,000 to cover the projected loss from hockey operations for the upcoming season. This is expected to leave the Association with a total net reserve at the end of next season of about \$30,000.

The Association's cash reserves are required to allow for unanticipated increases in the amount of ice available and actually used during a

given season, to periodically cover losses from hockey operations such as the loss projected for the 2011-12 season, and to finance unanticipated major equipment purchases (such as 'home' and 'away' hockey jerseys). As well, the cash reserve provides the Association with some flexibility to form an additional team at one or more of the divisions should the "tiering" of the players into A, B, and C levels require it. The creation of an additional team creates an added expense, primarily for ice and referees, of at least \$5,000 to \$7,000 per team depending on the division. The creation of an additional team may not involve any increase in registration revenues to offset this added expense if the number of players remains within our forecast as the resulting teams would be smaller than initially planned.

Family Discount Plan: As in recent years, the family discount plan will still be available. **Families with 3 or more hockey players** registered with the Canterbury Hockey Association as their 'home' association will receive a **discount of \$75.00 per child** off their 2011-12 registration fees otherwise payable at the time of their registration. For example, the total discount for a family of three players would be \$225.00; and for a family with four players, the total discount would be \$300.00.

However, please be advised that the family discount for a player who makes a competitive team **may not** be honoured by all competitive associations and a 'top-up' fee equal to the discount may be required by the competitive association.

Special Note to families requiring financial assistance: If you require financial assistance to cover all or part of your hockey registration fees, we strongly encourage you to contact one of the following organizations for such assistance as soon as possible:

While these organizations will not usually process a request for financial assistance for hockey after 30 September 2011, they may run out of funds for their granting period before that time. Therefore, the sooner one applies, the better your chances of receiving assistance *if you qualify*.

If financial assistance is not available from other sources, the **CHA's Jannis Klein Fund for Kids** may be available to help those with an identified and confirmed financial need. A CHA Request for Financial Assistance/Subsidy form, available from the CHA Treasurer at treasurer@canterburyhockey.ca, would need to be completed and submitted, in confidence, to the CHA Treasurer in order to be considered for such assistance.

Special Note to new players: For any new or first time hockey player, you must include a photocopy of the player's birth certificate as proof of age. For players moving into the Bytown District, a Declaration of Residence (*copies of which are available on our website: www.canterburyhockey.ca*) must be signed by your previous hockey association and submitted to the CHA along with proof of residency (e.g. copy of a driver's licence or the top portion of your hydro or telephone bill with your name and new address).

Special Note for players

transferring to CHA from another area:

A reminder for those players who live outside the CHA boundaries and wish to play in the CHA that the District B rules require that a transfer form (*available on our website: www.canterburyhockey.ca*) be **completed and signed before your registration is considered complete and before the player is allowed on the ice** by the CHA. If you obtained a transfer last season to play in the CHA from another 'home' association and if you wish to once again play in the CHA, you will require a transfer for the current season. However, it is up to your 'home' association whether it will grant you a transfer for the current season.

Special Note to Juvenile players:

Last season we had to make a decision in early September on the number of Juvenile teams that the CHA would enter for the Gloucester Juvenile League. At that time, despite several emails sent to all eligible Juvenile-aged players, we did not have any registered Juvenile players although we had 3 players who had expressed an interest in playing Juvenile hockey but who had not submitted a registration form.

Therefore, we decided not to form a Juvenile team in 2010-11. After the decision was made and conveyed to the Gloucester Juvenile League, we subsequently had an expression of interest from about another 2 or 3 Juvenile players – but it was too late, although we tried to place all interested Juvenile players on other teams within the Gloucester Juvenile League. If you are interested in playing Juvenile hockey in the 2011-12 season, we encourage you to register as early as possible.

To further encourage Juvenile players to register and in recognition that their school (college or university) or work schedule may not be known until late summer, the CHA Executive has decided not to charge players at this level a late fee should they register after June 30th.

The number of Juvenile teams that the CHA will have this coming season will be determined, in part, by the number of Juvenile players who are registered by early September 2011 and, equally important, by the number of parents who step forward and volunteer their time as a Juvenile coach, assistant coach, or trainer.

Children's Tax Credits: The Government of Canada currently allows a parent (or step-parent) to claim a maximum of \$500.00 per year (subject to change) for eligible fees paid by parents to register a child, who is under 16 at any time during the year, in an **eligible program** of physical activity – one that has a minimum of one session per week for eight (8) weeks – such as a hockey program. This credit is referred to as the Federal Children's Fitness Tax Credit.

This claim will be made as part of one's **federal** non-refundable tax credits by either parent provided that another person/parent has not already claimed the same fees and that the total claimed does not exceed the maximum amount that would be allowed if only one of you were claiming the tax credit. The year in which the tax credit can be claimed is determined by the date when the fees are paid, not when the activity takes place.

In a similar way, the Province of Ontario allows a parent (or step-parent) who is a resident of Ontario to claim a maximum of \$500.00 per year for eligible fees paid by parents to register a child, who is under 16 at any time during the year, in an **eligible program** of activity – one that has a minimum of one session per week for eight (8) weeks – such as a hockey program. This credit is referred to as the Ontario Children's Activity Tax Credit.

For the 2011-12 season, the CHA will only issue receipts in February 2012 for the net amount of the 'basic' registration fees actually paid to the Association on or before 31 December 2011. This will ensure, in view of the definition of an eligible program that any player withdrawals or refunds, in whole or in part, through to 31 December 2011 will be taken into account in determining whether a receipt can be issued and the appropriate amount of the receipt. Consequently, no refunds for the 2011-12 season will be issued after 31 December 2011.

Although you will not need to submit the receipt issued to you by the CHA when you file your 2011 tax return, you will need to keep your receipt in case the Canada Revenue Agency asks for them when verifying your claim. Receipts should be kept for six (6) years.

Please note that any amount paid for late fees and for the Ottawa 67's tickets are not eligible for the Children's Fitness Tax Credit since late fees and the Ottawa 67's tickets are not an integral part of a program of prescribed physical activity.

Player's making a competitive team: If a player whose home association is the CHA makes a competitive team (i.e., the Ottawa Jr. 67's AAA Hockey Club or the Ottawa Sting Minor Hockey Association), the actual amount paid to the CHA will be transferred to the appropriate competitive association. However, it should be noted that, depending on their policies, the competitive association may or may not honour the family discount provided by the home association and may not credit any late fees transferred to the player's account but may place them instead into a Fund for Kids to help those with an identified and confirmed financial need.

Thanks to our Volunteers

For the 2010-11 season, the Canterbury Hockey Association had 154 volunteers who served as team officials - that is, either as coach, assistant coach, trainer, or manager, including 26 individuals who served as a team official on more than one team. The CHA Executive Committee also had 14 volunteers who helped to keep things running as smoothly as possible. A big thank you goes out to all those who answered the call to become involved.

Showing our appreciation: To show our appreciation to these volunteers for their hard work throughout the season, the CHA held a Volunteer Appreciation Night on Tuesday, 12 April 2011 at Lorenzo's Restaurant. Almost 60 volunteers came to this end-of-season social event and enjoyed some pizza and wings along with refreshments. In addition, there were door prizes for almost all in attendance – comprised of, among other things, pullovers and T-shirts, knapsacks, gift certificates from Lorenzo's, and (especially for the ladies) gift certificates for a spa and hair products.

Many others help too: We would also like to thank the many other 'unofficial' volunteers, that is, the parents and older siblings, who help out at games to keep score, run the clock, or help organize team activities at home or on the road. We would like to thank these 'unofficial' volunteers for their help in enabling the games to go on as scheduled.

Don't wait to volunteer for next season: It is never too early to volunteer for the upcoming season. Volunteer Registration

Requirements

All Canterbury Minor Hockey Association (CHA) volunteers, including managers, are required to complete the Speak Out course and a Police Record check. If you are a returning volunteer, both must be completed prior to the start of the 2011-2012 season. If you are a first time volunteer, you must complete the Speak Out within 90 days of the first game and your PRC application should be submitted with your registration or sent directly to our Risk and Safety director. For more information on the PRC process see <http://www.canterburyhockey.ca/volunteers.htm>. The Speak Out clinics usually start in mid September, see the Clinics menu at <http://www.odha.com/> for schedules. eHockey is now used to register for clinics so things may look a bit different.

PRC Scenario – see corresponding Solution below

- 1) First time volunteer in 2011-2012
- 2) PRC has expired during last season or will expire during 2011-2012 season
- 3) Did not submit a PRC application in 2010-2011, but helped on a team
- 4) Submitted a PRC application in 2010-2011 but still Incomplete
- 5) Returned from police with "Hit"
- 6) Volunteered in the past but not in 2010-2011
- 7) I have an existing process PRC from another organization

PRC Solution

- 1) See our website for detailed information on how to complete the PRC process.
- 2) You will be treated as a first time volunteer for the 2011-2012 season.
- 3) You must complete the PRC process prior to joining a team in 2011-2012 season.
- 4) You most likely have a returned copy of the PRC from the police but we don't. Or you may have submitted it to us and our records are not up to date or it didn't make it through to the correct person. We need a copy, so please submit a copy to our Risk and Safety director, it is best to make a copy for your records as well. It needs to be completed before you join a team next season.
- 5) Contact our Risk and Safety director.
- 6) You will be treated as a first time volunteer for the 2011-2012 season.
- 7) We will honour that PRC for a maximum of 5 years from the approval date, if it was done within the last 5 years

How do I complete the PRC process before the start of next season?

If your prefilled application does not have an expiry date then your PRC status is Incomplete. If you cannot find your Police reviewed copy, the best thing to do is start the PRC process now. Either obtain the volunteer letter from our Risk and Safety director and submit it with the application directly to the Police department (Ottawa Police should waive their processing fee with the letter) and let the process run its

course. No guarantee this will be completed by the start of the season. Or, simply pay the express processing fee. CHA will not reimburse anyone for the express processing fee. Regardless of why your PRC is incomplete, it is best to start the process now. Volunteers with incomplete status will not be allowed to join a team in 2011-2012 season until they complete the PRC process!

Hockey Canada Qualifications

Existing volunteers, who were active on a team in 2010-2011, have received a pre-filled 2011-2012 registration containing their current Hockey Canada qualifications. If you feel a qualification is missing, please contact the CHA registrar. Incomplete clinics may have to be taken again and those volunteers may be prevented from being added to the official team roster.

Coaches Clinic

All clinics, including coaches, are composed of 3 criteria which must be completed:

- 1) Attended – Attend all required sessions of the clinic
- 2) Passed – Usually proper attendance will constitute a pass
- 3) Certified – Typically a post task with coach mentor sign off submitted to ODHA

Once you attend a coach's clinic, ODHA submits your name to Coaches Canada who issues you a CC#. This number does not mean you have successfully completed the clinic. You are not a qualified coach until ODHA has "certified" you, which means you have, attended, passed and completed any required pre, post or in class tasks/assignments within the allotted time. It is your responsibility to know when your completion date is, they typically tell you during the clinic. Once you are certified, ODHA will send you a confirmation letter with your ODHA coach's card, blue for Coaches Stream or green for Development. Starting in 2011-2012, the Speak Out will no longer be included in the Coaches Clinics and must be taken separately.

!! You are not a certified coach until you obtain your coaches card from ODHA !!

Coaches CC#

On behalf of the coaches with missing CC#'s, the CHA registrar, supplied your contact information to Coaches Canada. Therefore, you may receive or have already received an email from Coaches Canada, with your CC# and or Coaches Canada account information. Alternatively, you can contact Coaches Canada directly to obtain your CC#.

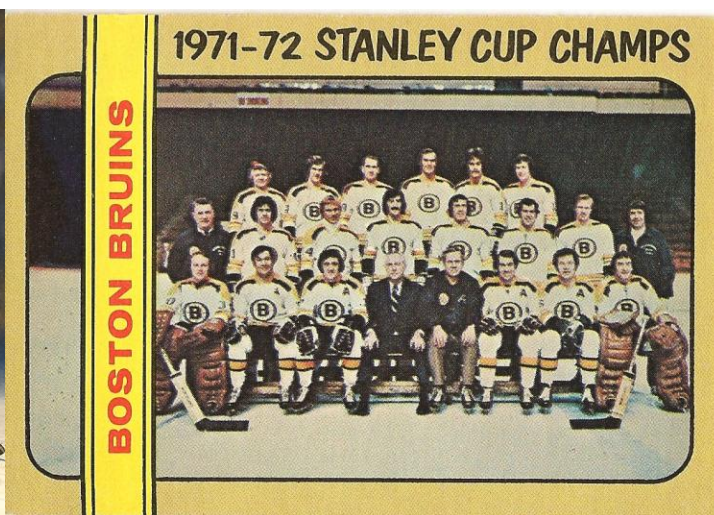
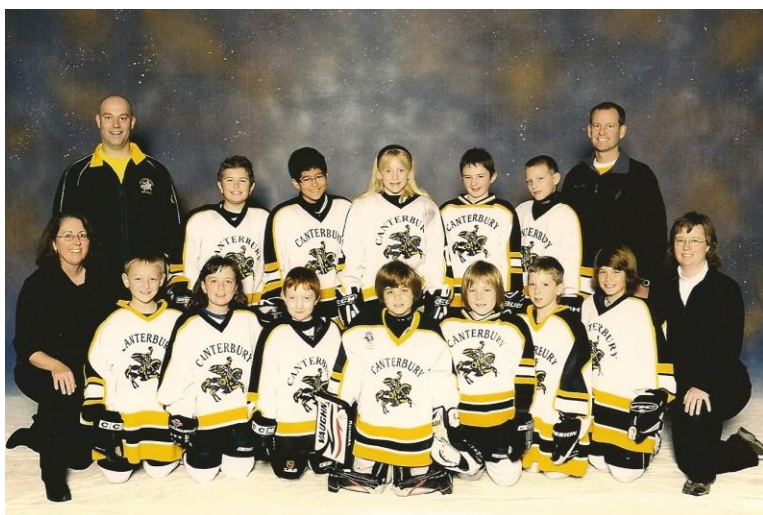
Notes:

IP - All IP Instructional staff are required to take the IP clinic. IP on ice helpers are not required to take the IP clinic. An on ice helper is someone to help setup drills/stations, chase pucks, coral kids, etc but should not be instructing the players.

Development Stream - There is no requirement for house league coaches to obtain development stream training, therefore CHA will not automatically reimburse for these clinics. However, CHA may have requirements for such positions to promote player development. If you are interested in taking a development stream clinic you should discuss it with our coach mentor.

Fees Reimbursement

CHA will reimburse volunteers for Speak Out and other approved clinics upon full completion of the specified clinic and completion of the PRC process. To be reimbursed, pay for and attend the clinic, complete any clinic pre and post tasks, complete your PRC, submit a copy of the receipts to your team manager or directly to the CHA treasurer.

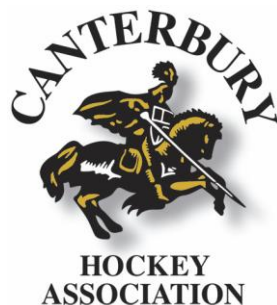
